Our plan for 2009, is to obtain a grant from the Llano County Hotel Occupancy Tax fund. If approved, we will buy 50,000 Hybrid Striped Bass Fingerlings from Keo Fish Farms who will transport and release them into the lake. We will also Buy One Million Hybrid Striper Fry and release those into the lake. I presented our plan to the Llano County Tourism Committee on March 3rd and **they approved our request!** It now goes to the Commissioner's Court on March 23rd, 9:00 AM at the Law Enforcement Center on Hwy 16 North in Llano.
